Matters Arising

1. A. Wallace represented the Standburn PTA and distributed a letter asking for support in their campaign to have the playing field in Standburn brought up to standard. It was asked if once this campaign has finished if the PTA would be willing to support the community council with some form of traffic calming campaign.

2. H. Freckleton concerns regarding the poor condition of the road adjacent to Standburn Primary and the playing fields has been inspected by Councillor McLuckie and will be taken up with the appropriate department.
3. Traffic calming measures have been introduced in Standburn in the form of an electronic boards/signs, which warns traffic if they are exceeding the speed limit. The sign at the east end of the village at this moment although erected does not appear to be operational. It would appear that we have to wait until the council switch on the sign.
4. Concerns were again raised regarding off road motorcycle riding in the field directly next to the East of Standburn village and PC Brown again recommends that concerned villagers should phone and complain when this happens and the Police will act upon any complaints made. There was some discussion regarding the Community right to buy, as the land would be an asset to the community by enlarging the already highly successful Drumbowie Park.
